Approval of Agenda- Glen made a motion to approve the agenda. Rich seconded. The motion passed.

Secretary's Report The minutes of the previous meeting were presented. <u>Amy made a motion to</u> approve minutes as corrected. Seconded by Norm W. – The motion passed

Treasurer's Report The treasurer's report for the month of April 2023 was presented. <u>Motion made to accept Treasurer's Report by Norm W. and was seconded by Glen - Motion passed</u>

Pastor's Report – Janet read a letter to the Council from Pastor Peterson thanking the congregation and wishing us well.

Old Business

1. Trustees Report

- a. Norm K. updated the council the progress in the parsonage. Painting was done by the Levijoki Crew for \$6,300.
- b. Carpet cleaning is going to be completed on June 22
- c. There was discussion about possibly replacing some blinds and a bathroom door.
- d. A bid from Blackburn to tile the basement and install a pump was received. The costs would be approximately \$10,000 for repair one wall and \$18,000 for 3 walls. This was followed by a discussion of feasibility.
- e. A dead pine tree needs removal. They are researching on how to best remove them.
- f. Wade Hoefert agreed to paint indicator lines on the parking lot.
- g. Trustees proposed covering any moving expenses incurred by the Bendorfs, which was followed by discussion.
- h. **SPECIAL THANK YOU** to Robin and Sophia Gigov, Kathy and Norm Whitaker, Greg and Arlys Skyberg and anyone else who helped, for the care and beautification of the parsonage yard and flowers

2. Deacon and Deaconesses

- a. Devon reported that they would provide fellowship on June 30
- b. Communion will be on July 2, 16, and 30
- c. New member induction will possibly be in September
- d. There was discussion about sending off Pastor Peterson and compensation for Stuart Twite for helping with services.
- e. <u>A motion was made by Jackie G. to provide compensation and was seconded by Devon. Motion passed.</u>
- f. Pastor Nathan Bendorf's first church service will be July 9 and his installation is scheduled for July 16th with the Bishop leading the service.

3. Board of Education

- a. 3 students will be attending Confirmation Camp on June 25-30. Jake Anderson volunteered to drive them to NeSoDak and Austie Olsen will bring them home.
- b. VBS is scheduled for the evenings of July 24-26. Volunteers are needed

4. President

- a. Call Committee will continue on for 6 months to help with Pastor's transition into our congregational family
- b. Council discussed ways/events to welcome the Bendorf family to the community
- c. There is still an opening for a Deacon on the Board
- d. First draft of a procedure for presenting submissions of by-laws changes is still being considered by Todd Wilkinson
