## A Reflection on Our First 3 Years in Ministry Together

On June 21, 2019 my brother-in-law Jeremey and myself arrived at the parsonage. 8 ALC members greeted us and immediately we went about unloading in the U-Haul within 2 hours. It was an extremely impressive feat. I am still and will always be extremely grateful for those of you from church who helped us move that day! Thank you!

June 24, 2019 was officially my first day in the office. It's crazy to think that it has been 3 full years now that I have been serving as your Called and Ordained Pastor! What a precious gift it is to walk alongside you, celebrate with you, grieve with you, minister to you and serve with you! Thank you for taking a chance on a First Call Pastor and allowing me to learn some of what it means to be a pastor serving a people of God in a specific time and place!

Yet, hardly anything about my first 3 years with you all has been normal. Much of which is attributed to the COVID-19 Pandemic beginning approximately 9 months after I began serving you. While these 3 years have now come and gone, I'd be lying if I said they went quickly. Because they haven't gone quickly for the vast majority of us.

The past couple years have been taxing on nearly all of us. There is a lot of unspoken hurt, loss, death, grief, depression, anxiety that many, many people are carrying with them still. Unsure of how to express it to those who care the most about them like their spouse, parents or siblings. Because maybe we know that person who loves us is struggling with their own sense of doubt or grief or change. Maybe it is because we know that in unloading our unspoken issues on someone else we may very well be overburdening them and causing them undue hardship.

Fortunately, you do have someone who's calling in life is to hear those things and respond sharing the love of God, your pastor. It is a holy and sacred part of ministry to be invited into those extremely difficult conversations so that you have an opportunity to hear out loud that God loves you for you. That God loves the you that you even try to hide from the world. I don't want to us to dwell in our entirety on this, but I would be doing a disservice to the honest truth of our reality if I were to simply ignore this topic all together.

There have been many other aspects of shared ministry worth celebrating. Firstly, of course was the wonderful  $100^{th}$  Anniversary of the merging of St. Petri and St. Pauli into "The American Lutheran Congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church." Of course over time members from St. Matthews, East Bethany and West Bethany also came into the history, mission and ministry of ALC between 1920-1970.

In these first 3 years there have been continual improvements to our church building that have changed the functionality of the space. The lighting in the sanctuary was greatly improved. Most people have forgotten how dark it used to be in there. But I can tell you that folks who have not been in the congregation in many years are immediately taken aback. The breezeway was redone and a wheelchair lift was installed going up the stairs of the Education Unit. Now, those with limited mobility are able to access approximately 80% of the church building! A new gable was constructed over the entrance of the church to help create a more welcoming space away from the elements outside with a small ramp for accessibility purposes.

There have been 8 people baptized; 7 children and 1 adult. On the other hand, there have been approximately 25 funerals. However, 10 of those funerals have had Holy Communion which is a brand new practice for ALC's history! I can't tell you the number of parishioners who have remarked just how special or meaningful it was to take Holy Communion in the midst of the funeral or who would like it at their own funeral. There have been over 30 youth who have Affirmed their Baptism through the Rite of Confirmation. ALC has had 1 wedding. (Obviously this is another thing greatly impacted by COVID-19.) There are two future ALC weddings scheduled for August of 2022. ALC members also stepped up and took on a new challenge of doing Vacation Bible School without the assistance of Bible Camp Staff (because there is a shortage of Camp Staff, most camps have cut their VBS programing).

There are some new things on the horizon for ALC. The future looks hopeful. I'm grateful that you have Called me to walk alongside you as you discern all that God has planned for you in De Smet, South Dakota, the USA and the world. May you continue to listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit to do the important work the Father has called you into, that is, sharing with everyone the impact of the saving work of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

## Synod Assembly Recap

The 2022 South Dakota Synod Assembly was held on June 3-4, 2022 at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls, SD. It was good to be gathered as God's people in South Dakota for the first time in person since 2019. Pastors, deacons, lay members, and visitors gathered each day in worship to center ourselves on the necessary work of the church. Assembly participants were invited to *imagine* new ways of being church through a series of Imagination Labs. In addition to worship and learning, here are some of the highlights of the synod assembly:

Rev. Keith Fry, executive for administration in the Office of the Secretary, delivered the ELCA report on behalf of our Presiding Bishop, Rev. Elizabeth Eaton. Together, the congregations in the South Dakota Synod made it possible for the synod to share \$812,120 with the churchwide organization to support our ministry together.

Bishop Constanze Hagmaier shared highlights of the past year of synod ministry including the call of Pastor Alan Blankenfeld to serve as the synod's Rural Ministry Liaison and the formation of the Digital Ministry Task Force. These new initiatives will support congregations and ministry sites of the South Dakota Synod imagine new ways of being church together in order that the Gospel will continue to be proclaimed throughout the South Dakota Synod. The "Church Basement Ladies" from Split Rock Lutheran Church provided commentary and challenged us all to not be afraid of change.

Peggy Hahn, Executive Director of LEAD (Living Everyday as Disciples), was the keynote speaker. Peggy challenged us to think of "church" as a verb: from *going to church* to *sent to be the church*.

Throughout the assembly, Glocal Musicians provided music leadership. Glocal is a coalition of musician educators that create music influenced by global themes in communities worldwide.

Actions approved by the Synod Assembly included:

- 1. Election of new South Dakota Synod Council Members and approval of synod committee members.
- 2. Approval of new compensation and guidelines for rostered and lay staff.
- 3. A memorial was adopted to the 2022 Churchwide Assembly to review the process for on leave from call roster status.
- 4. The 2023 Mission Plan for the South Dakota Synod was adopted.

Thank you to all, and Tristin Gruenhagen, Bonita Albrecht & Pastor Jonathan who participated in the synod assembly this year!

#### Someday Might Be Too Late

Thinking about a will or trust makes nearly everyone a world-class procrastination expert. There's no can easier to kick down the road than setting an appointment with an attorney and committing plans for all our worldly possessions to a legal document. "I'll get to it **someday**, after\_\_\_\_\_\_" or "We'll have more time **someday**, when \_\_\_\_\_\_ is done."

I'm sharing very personal thoughts this month, in hopes that each of us are motivated to do the hard work and stop counting on someday. My dad recently had heart incident that earned him a helicopter ride and a few days in the hospital (and thankfully, a full recovery). Behind all of the expected worry and stress was a very real, very practical concern. I knew my parents had been working on amendments to their estate plan for years, but nothing has been finalized. The decisions are complicated and emotional, and easy to ignore. In those initial moments when the future looked bleak, thoughts of the potential nightmare of settling an estate without clear, legal instructions and guidance were unavoidable.

I'm incredibly grateful that my sweet, ornery dad is still with us. The grief of losing a parent can be unbearably hard. But wading through business decisions and questions and potential arguments without guidance because someone planned on a **someday** that didn't come, makes it so much

harder. Can we all agree to make a difference by making *today* our *someday*?
